- The Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1, Level AA, the internationally recognised benchmark for web accessibility.

- Built with consistent page structure and logical tab order

We:

- Regularly review pages for accessibility issues
- Update older content to meet current standards
- Use automated and manual testing tools to identify barriers
- Train staff and contributors on accessibility best practices
- Prioritise fixes for any issues that could block access to content or services
